Our Carving Progress

Jordan Makower's Linoleum Blocks Burchell' Zebras

This is a 4" x 3" linoleum block.

I was inspired to start this after seeing Ed Haskett's carving in the recent issue of the California Carvers Guild, and Joanne Carroll's piece, "Mother and Child".

Zebras stay in a group to confuse predators. They seem to then appear as a single larger animal. I think closely related animals have almost identical stripe patterns. Burchell's Zebra show stripes fading on their legs.

The background and foreground are carved as blades of tall grass.





Jordan Makower's Grays' Bunny

This linoleum block is 3" x 4". "Stellaluna" is my granddaughter's brown and white bunny. The foreground, background, and bunny fur still need to be worked on, then a test print will determine what needs to be adjusted.

This was really difficult to print. I only could get 3 relatively good prints out of 15 tries. This is one of the three.





Rena Gooding Carved a Snowman
