Our Carving Progress

Jordan Makower's Linoleum Blocks



St James Playground, 1950



T. JAMOS PLALOUND, BLONN (190)

The block was printed twice, once in brown and then in black:

There is a lot of detail in the block that doesn't show in the print. Difficult for me to find 13 humans, 1 baby carriage, 1 ice cream cart, ... maybe there is more?

The playground has been modernized. Nothing of the original remains, except for the part of the park it was built on. Newer, safer things have replaced what I remember.

The playground was printed in black. This ink revealed details not discernible in the brown prints.

The Bear is an older block, but I reprinted it using a higher grade Speedball paper, specifically for linoleum printing.



The Engagement Ring (1958)

This is a 4" x 5"'linoleum block.

Major features have been outlined. Details, perspective, depth, shading are worked on next.

Shown is the carving, then it is inked and shows more detail, and the final print in lower right corner.
