
# **Our Carving Progress**

#### Jordan Makower's Linoleum Blocks

### Yearling encounter

I found a picture that I took while hiking in the Catskills area in 1959, and thought it might look well in a linoleum print. The block is 4" x 5". Experimenting here with the spacing of fine lines to convey fur length, shadows, and distances. The deer was about 1 year old and had 'velvety' antlers.

All the fine lines on this linoleum block will not show up in the print. I'd like to capture the 'velvety' appearance of the newly-grown antlers. I've added a few background lines to hint at distant woods.





## **Yin-Yang Chineese Dragons**

The linoleum block is 2" x 3". This is intricate carving. I'm at the limit of my skills and tools.









#### Ester's MG

Linoleum block 4" x 5".

Haven't decided on the rendering of the background: Stores, wall, lane divider...?


Whatever it turns out to be, it might be done with a separate printing color, leaving red for the MG.

The tires and bottom corner might be printed in black.

I've removed the 'roadway' using 'perspective' cuts, in case those partial lines emerge during printing. Any remaining lines would suggest the speed of the car. Partial lines under the car are meant to indicate the MG's shadow.
